

The idea of the typical American teenager has changed a lot over the decades, but somehow that image we all have in our minds has traits that stay the same from generation to generation. That image is, of course, influenced by the movies, television and music from when we were younger, and we were those "typical American teenagers." Of course, we can also pinpoint what a "typical American teenager" from a time other than ours is based on the media of those generations.

All of that to say, no one is typical. Some of us spent summers at the beach, while others were working away at malt shops or some other job. Some of us found love under the stars, and some of us suffered from severe mental disorders that caused us to rampage through our communities as we wreaked havoc and caused panic and horror at every turn... See, no one is typical.

I'm thankful that Charles Busch isn't a typical playwright. He's been creating offbeat stories for well over 40 years and, as quirky as they are, they still feel familiar. Even when working with a convention we all know at first sight, he finds a way to twist and turn it, so we're entertained and surprised. He takes the typical and makes it very unexpected, outlandish and nonconforming, but above all he knows how to take these situations and make them hilarious.

Psycho Beach Party is a very special show for me, which I know might make your head spin a little. 20 years ago, it was the first ever queer show I was a part of. It introduced me to camp as an artform, and opened the doors to a community that is the bedrock of this theatre. I'm forever grateful to this show, to Charles Busch and to everyone in our community for showing time and time again that just when we think something is "normal," we prove the opposite to be true. No one is typical, and I'm grateful for that too.

VISION



EQUALITY, DIVERSITY, & INCLUSION COMMITMENT

The staff and board of Out Front Theatre Company want to put the following metrics in place so that we can track them to completion. We want our stakeholders and our patrons to see real results.

- We want to have representative board members from black and brown communities, as well as gender nonconforming representatives and increase that representation by at least 10% every year until we reach a goal of above 50%.
- We want to produce, support, or promote at least 2 shows/events from creatives of color every year and increase that number by at least 20% every year.
- We want to increase our presence in communities of color and in women's communities through intentional outreach. We can do this by creating a communication strategy to expand our patronage. To that end, we will recruit a community outreach intern or staff member to help achieve this goal.
- We want to increase our intersectional involvement by partnering with other socially progressive nonprofit organizations to collaborate on community events. The goal is to have at least one partner event per year with an ultimate goal of three per year.

Charles Busch, the Importance of **Escapism, and the "Fathomless** Possibilities of the Human Comedy"

In the 1978 New York Times review of Charles Busch's breakout comedy Vampire Lesbians of Sodom, one critic wrote that the play boasted "costumes flashier than pinball machines, outrageous lines, awful puns, sinister innocence, and harmless depravity." Over the last forty years, these qualities have all become hallmarks of Busch's work as he's ensured his place as a prolific and singular voice in American gueer theatre. From his pulpy underground shows like Theodora, She-Bitch of Byzantium (1984) and up to the Tony Awardnominated comedy The Tale of the Allergist's Wife (2000), Busch's plays have thrilled



audiences with their gaudy spectacle, lowbrow puns, highbrow references, and contained chaos.

An early childhood tragedy saw Busch moving to Manhattan to live with his aunt, where he withdrew into the world of old movies - an obsession that continues to influence every corner of his body of work. While at Northwestern University, he wrote and starred in his first drag piece. As he wrote in his memoir, Busch saw drag less "an expression of outrage" and more "a passageway to channel the feminine in my nature, which turned out to be a place of authority." His embrace of camp - of artifice and exaggeration, as Susan Sontag put it - became central to his plays as well.

It also made Busch a central figure in Theatre of the Ridiculous, a movement that combined gueer performance aesthetics with experimental theatre. From its emergence in gritty, off-off-Broadway spaces in the mid-1960s, Theatre of the Ridiculous surpassed the bounds of absurdism in its aim to skewer realism in theatre and heteronormative society at large. Escapism was always a core tenet to Theatre of the Ridiculous, but as scholar Sean F. Edgecomb argues, by the time Busch entered the scene amidst the HIV/AIDS crisis, escapism "became a selfprotective mode for collective agency."



Understanding this context is key to understanding Psycho Beach Party, which premiered in 1987. Director Paul Conroy has repeatedly emphasized the importance of escapism, and while **Psycho Beach Party** may not appear to be tackling "serious" subject matter, it still fundamentally exists as a piece of queer resistance. As Edgecomb stresses, Busch's work may not have been written to "criticize the social injustices of Reagan-era America," but it still provided "a few hours of fun and entertainment for an audience whose lives revolved around a melancholic uncertainty." Silliness is serious business.

Times change, however, and Psycho Beach Party has changed with it. Busch has given the play some rewrites specifically for Out Front Theatre Company - a far cry from its late-night premiere in 1987, where Busch himself played the lead role of Chicklet. Something like **Psycho Beach Party** - that was written for a very specific audience, venue, and context - might not always stand up to contemporary critical scrutiny, but this isn't necessarily a bad thing. Theatre is a living art form, and plays are constantly being reinterpreted by different artists and audiences. The play may not resonate with its original context, but it can still meet this new one and provide a few hours of entertainment for an audience in need of a good time.

Dramaturgy

Here are the girls! Here are the boys! Here are the songs! And young romantic joys!" These words appear in pastel on the first frames of the trailer for Beach Party, the 1963 film that is credited with spawning the "Beach Party" film genre of the 1960s. In a way, these words sum up the core appeals of the genre: teenagers, music, and romance, packaged in pastel colors and California sunshine.

Beach Party (1963) was produced by American International Pictures (AIP) and starred Frankie Avalon and Annette Funicello, who would appear in seven more films in the genre. AIP ultimately created 11 beach party films, and every other major studio of the 1960s made at least one, though most were not as successful as AIP. These movies were pure escapism in the midst of a tumultuous time in U.S. history. Topics such as the Vietnam War, the Civil Rights Movement, and the sexual revolution were blithely absent from these films. Instead they abound with surfing, dancing, and skimpy bathing suits.

Psycho Beach Party begins with this atmosphere, utilizing many elements of the beach party formula, and then adds in plot points and imagery from Alfred Hitchcock's psychological thrillers-most notably Spellbound (1945) and Marnie (1964). Hitchcock was a famous English film director, known as the "Master of Suspense" for his ability to maximize an audience's fear and anxiety. Both Spellbound and Marnie portray a protagonist with a psychological disorder which can be triggered by seemingly unremarkable things, like parallel lines, or the color red.

By the time **Psycho Beach Party** premiered at the Limbo Lounge in 1986, the beach party era and Hitchcock thrillers were objects of nostalgia, but the play also took inspiration from a more contemporary influence—teen slasher movies. Slashers had their "golden age" from 1978 to 1984, spurred on by the success of Halloween (1978) and marked by hits like Friday the 13th (1980) and A Nightmare on Elm Street (1984). While this play may not include any actual murders, one can't deny there is something Kruegeresque in the hovering dread that haunts these innocent teens in the form of a mysterious shaver.

Psycho Beach Party may not be very subtle about borrowing from these suspenseful films, but you'll probably find that it avoids the dark and serious tone associated with Hitchcock's thrillers, or the right-behind-you terror brought on by the slashers. Instead it leans into the silliness and escapism that come with teenagers goofing around on a beach and ultimately finding solutions to all of their problems. Indeed, *Psycho Beach Party* is not to be taken too seriously. Instead, I encourage you to lean into the fun and hilarity of it all-that's what parties are for.

conversations and minds our audiences and artists. Theatre's power as a catalyst to spur dialogues goes back thousands of years. Out Front lives to continue that grand tradition of bringing the stories of the LGBTQIA+ people into the spotlight.

LGBTQIA+ Definitions

L stands for Lesbian: Term used to describe female identified people attracted romantically, erotically, and/or emotionally to other female identified people.

G stands for Gay: Term used in some cultural settings to represent male identified people who are attracted to other male identified people in a romantic, erotic and/or emotional sense. Also, a term used to refer to the LGBTQIA+ community as a whole or as an individual identity label for anyone who does not identify as heterosexual.

B stands for Bisexual: A person emotionally, physically, and/or sexually attracted to people of more than one sex and/or gender. This attraction does not have to be equally split between genders and there may be a preference for one gender over others.

T stands for Transgender: A person who lives as a member of a gender other than that expected based on anatomical sex. Sexual orientation varies and is not dependent on gender identity. This term is sometimes used to refer to the gender variant community as a whole.

Q stands for Queer: An umbrella term, which embraces a matrix of sexual preferences, orientations, and habits of the not-exclusively-heterosexual-and-monogamous majority. Queer includes lesbians, gays, bisexuals, transpeople, intersex persons, and many other sexually transgressive explorers. The term is sometimes used as a sexual orientation label instead of 'bisexual' as a way of acknowledging that there are more than two genders to be attracted to, or as a way of stating a non-heterosexual orientation without having to state who they are attracted to.

I stands for Intergender: Intergender people have a gender identity that is in the middle between the binary genders of female and male, and may be a mix of both.

A stands for Asexual: A term describing individuals who do not experience sexual attraction or do not have interest in or desire for sex. Asexuality is different from celibacy, which means abstaining from sex. Asexuality is often viewed as a spectrum – meaning there are varying levels and identities regarding someone's emotional, spiritual and romantic attraction. The best way to refer to the asexual community is to use the umbrella term "ace" or "aces" as in the "ace community," which acknowledges that spectrum.

+ stands for Many Other Identifications

including, but not limited to pansexual, genderqueer, polysexual, agender, androsexual, demisexual, and skoliosexual. We strive to be as inclusive as we can and know we can always improve.

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


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
