A Note from Paul

It's funny how life works.

I can remember going to the Kendell Square movie theater in Cambridge (the other side of the river from Boston) with my friends in 1999 to see the movie "Trick". For years after we would pepper conversations with quotes from the film, and



over those following years I rewatched it multiple times and remembered how much I enjoyed it each time.

Fast forward to November 2021; 22 years after I first saw "Trick". Out Front had reopened after the pandemic in October with a production of the musical *Xanadu*, and our audiences were thrilled with the silly, sweet love story which got me thinking; "How do we keep entertaining with musicals that have a positive an uplifting queer story when so few exist?" Then it hit me; 'It's time to get some of the great queer stories from other mediums on stage for audiences to fall in love with all over again.'

I don't how or where I found Jason Schafer's email online, but I sent him a message introducing myself and Out Front and my thought about adapting "Trick" into a musical. I didn't expect much, so when he responded and said he'd like to talk about the possibility it felt surreal.

Fast forward again to today. The World Premiere of *Trick! The Musical* and YOU are a part of it. It still feels dreamlike that we all are collectively here and for years and generations to come people will look back and know that this wonderfully, magical and endearing queer musical took its first steps on this stage. The importance of that shouldn't be lost on any of us, and if there is any lesson to learn it's that we should take the chance we are unsure of even if we think the answer should be no.

Take the chance and audition for the show.

Take a chance and ask that person out you see at the bar.

Take a chance and send that email to a stranger with a far-fetched dream.

You might get a "no", but there's always a chance that you'll get a "yes" and you'll realize how funny life works.

Out Front Theatre Company's vision is to strengthen the LGBTQIA+ community in Georgia by exploring and celebrating the universal human experience through the lens of gender and sexuality.

EQUALITY, DIVERSITY, & INCLUSION COMMITMENT

The staff and board of Out Front Theatre Company want to put the following metrics in place so that we can track them to completion. We want our stakeholders and our patrons to see real results.

- We want to have representative board members from black and brown communities, as well as gender nonconforming representatives and increase that representation by at least 10% every year until we reach a goal of above 50%.
- We want to produce, support, or promote at least 2 shows/events from creatives of color every year and increase that number by at least 20% every year.
- We want to increase our presence in communities of color and in women's communities through intentional outreach. We can do this by creating a communication strategy to expand our patronage. To that end, we will recruit a community outreach intern or staff member to help achieve this goal.
- We want to increase our intersectional involvement by partnering with other socially progressive nonprofit organizations to collaborate on community events. The goal is to have at least one partner event per year with an ultimate goal of three per year.

An interview with Jason Schafer, screenwriter of **Trick** (1999) the film and Out Front's world premiere stage musical.

Dramaturg Tom Fish discusses with Jason the evolution of his gay romcom from screen to stage.

I'd love to hear about the impetus of the story. Take us back to the 90s for a moment if you would...

I grew up in Sacramento, California, and I started writing musicals, actually in high school. And by the time I graduated from UCLA. I had three musicals written and produced. Right after college, moved to New York, and I was in the BMI (Broadcast Musical Inc.) writer's workshop, not unlike the writer group in the show. It's been around since the 60s, the 70s, and it's still going. Basically, writers meet and share work and critique. So, I did that for one year, and then you're supposed to start writing a musical. I was in the writer's workshop, and I was young and gay in New York. And I thought, "I'm gonna write something that's more relevant to my life." And that was the spark of *Trick*.



And, like Gabriel, you were living in a cramped apartment too I hear?

Yes, yes. So, I was in an apartment and most of the time there were three women and me, and it was a one bedroom. The bedroom was like a sorority with three twin beds. And I was in the living room. So, I went to Bed Bath and Beyond and got curtain panels, hung them on the ceiling. There was my bed, smashed

to one side, behind curtains. And that's what I lived in, a shared living room, not unlike Gabe.

What inspired you to write a gay romcom?

I actually started writing the story as a musical, and it was called "Gay Boy" at the time. In the writing process, I shared what I was working on with Anthony Rapp (from **Rent** stardom, but this was pre-**Rent**). He said, "Oh, this should be a movie!" It was the age of indie films; I was going to Angelica Film Center all the time. So, on a dime, I went from writing a musical to writing a movie before I'd even finished a draft.

One of the little magical moments in the *Trick* timeline was just after I finished it. I invited a bunch of people over to my apartment to read it aloud. One of the actors at the reading said, "I know someone who might be interested in this. Do you mind if I share it?" So, he went to a payphone with his script in hand-this was pre-cell phone days-and called Jim Fall, who ended up directing the movie.

I've mentioned to colleagues and friends about the new *Trick!* stage musical and I've been amazed at the responses to the film. One person had even danced to the movie's theme song "Trick of Fate" at his gay wedding. What do you think makes the story so impactful? It's been a little over 25 years since

the movie first debuted. Queer representation, specifically gay representation in films at the time, was often through AIDS movies and that was about it. There wasn't a lot of my experience. I was living in a


world, a bubble, that didn't have a lot of homophobia. It was New York City. At the time, you were very lucky and privileged to be open and out. So, while gay stories were focusing a lot on the hurdles and the obstacles, I found myself living in a world where I didn't experience that.

One of the most beautiful things about the legacy of the film is hearing how the movie showed that world to a lot of people...people who didn't have the privilege that I had living in New York and in this kind of safe space. The movie became a way for a lot of people to discover there's a different world out there or that a different world is possible. I didn't have lofty ideas at all, I just wanted to write the movie. I was like: "I'm not seeing this movie out in the world yet, and that's the movie I want to see."

So how did you connect with Out Front Theatre?

That was another one of those just random kind of events along the trajectory. I got a random email from Paul, and we met. There'd been a lot of dabbling in *Trick* as a musical, and people had approached me. But for me, hearing Paul talk about his company here in Atlanta and serving the queer community and wanting to tell uplifting stories for a queer audience, it unlocked the reason to do this. I love the movie, so I had to consider, "Do I want to change it? Would I want to go back?" The other challenge was putting it on stage. Because New York City is quite literally a character. How are you going to represent a city full of people in a way that a company, like Out Front, can actually put it on the stage? But just starting to imagine what this theater was like, even before I visited, I was confident, "Oh, I know how to do this." That call just opened the flood gates.

Is there anything that you are particularly excited for audiences to experience with the new musical?





is, I'm really excited for audiences to hear the score, which is made up of all new songs with terrific music by Artie Bacon. Another piece of it is the musical's drag role. It's Miss Coco Peru playing herself in the movie. Coco's brilliant. Coco's amazing. I wouldn't want to put another performer in the position of having to out Coco, Coco. I kind of knew right away that the role would be written for a local drag queen. I call her the "Drag Superstar" in the script, and she plays herself. The role gets tailored in small ways for each drag performer. Coco's material is obviously iconic, and I hope audiences find the new version iconic as well.

Do you have any particular hopes for the musical?

I want it to have a life. I mean, obviously. But I'm kind of letting it see where it goes. What's interesting is I've written other things over the years and even my friends are like, "Oh, I'm coming to Atlanta to see *this.*" I'm like, "You didn't come see my East Village show, but you're coming to Atlanta???" Yeah, people are excited about it!

Out Front hopes to create a narrative that will reach beyond the stage, into the

conversations and minds our audiences and artists. Theatre's power as a catalyst to spur dialogues goes back thousands of years. Out Front lives to continue that grand tradition of bringing the stories of the LGBTQIA+ people into the spotlight.

LGBTQIA+ Definitions

L stands for Lesbian: Term used to describe female identified people attracted romantically, erotically, and/or emotionally to other female identified people.

G stands for Gay: Term used in some cultural settings to represent male identified people who are attracted to other male identified people in a romantic, erotic and/or emotional sense. Also, a term used to refer to the LGBTQIA+ community as a whole or as an individual identity label for anyone who does not identify as heterosexual.

B stands for Bisexual: A person emotionally, physically, and/or sexually attracted to people of more than one sex and/or gender. This attraction does not have to be equally split between genders and there may be a preference for one gender over others.

T stands for Transgender: A person who lives as a member of a gender other than that expected based on anatomical sex. Sexual orientation varies and is not dependent on gender identity. This term is sometimes used to refer to the gender variant community as a whole. **Q stands for Queer:** An umbrella term, which embraces a matrix of sexual preferences, orientations, and habits of the not-exclusively-heterosexual-andmonogamous majority. Queer includes lesbians, gays, bisexuals, transpeople, intersex persons, and many other sexually transgressive explorers. The term is sometimes used as a sexual orientation label instead of 'bisexual' as a way of acknowledging that there are more than two genders to be attracted to, or as a way of stating a non-heterosexual orientation without having to state who they are attracted to.

I stands for Intergender: Intergender people have a gender identity that is in the middle between the binary genders of female and male, and may be a mix of both.

A stands for Asexual: A term describing individuals who do not experience sexual attraction or do not have interest in or desire for sex. Asexuality is different from celibacy, which means abstaining from sex. Asexuality is often viewed as a spectrum - meaning there are varying levels and identities regarding someone's emotional, spiritual and romantic attraction. The best way to refer to the asexual community is to use the umbrella term "ace" or "aces" as in the "ace community," which acknowledges that spectrum.

+ stands for Many Other Identifications

including, but not limited to pansexual, genderqueer, polysexual, agender, androsexual, demisexual, and skoliosexual. We strive to be as inclusive as we can and know we can always improve.
