AUDITION INFORMATION

WHEN: Auditions will be held **virtually**. Submissions will be accepted from Friday, October 11th, 2024 until Monday, October 21st, 2024 at 11:59 PM.

Callbacks will take place **in-person** at Out Front Theatre Company on **Monday**, **October 28th**, **2024**, **from 6:30 PM to 10:00 PM** and **Tuesday**, **October 29th**, **2024 from 6:30 to 10:00 PM**. Please note that some actors may be called back to both dates for chemistry reads, etc.

ROLES:

7 Roles

CARLO – a wedding guest. She/her

Sapphic with a searing wit, poetic command of text, dry quick humor and a deep emotional well that only reveals itself in flashes. At once charming, irreverent and clever, and then momentarily and fleetingly devastating. Chaotic-good(esque). *Possible moments of intimacy between Carlo + Leigh & Carlo + Eva.*

CARLY – a bridesmaid. She/her

A bit of a do-gooder with something hidden underneath. An edge? A violence? A bit holier than thou. But good at pretending like she's not.

ELI – a wedding guest. he/him

Sweet, poetic, nervous, a tad untethered, intelligent, earnest. A kind man. Also, later, maybe a mythological mariner from another space/time?

MARIA – mother of the bride. she/her

Mother. Icon behavior. Quick, dry, direct, charismatic. Sometimes tumultuous.

LEIGH – a wedding guest. they/them

Magnetic. Playful. Sharp wit. Perhaps Benedick to our Carlo's Beatrice. Or Beatrice to our Carlo's Benedick. Whatever the vibe. They have it. Chemistry.

Possible moments of intimacy between Carlo + Leigh

EVA – the bride. she/her

The one that got away. All the beauty, depth, familiarity, chemistry, anger and complexity that comes with that.

She is the bride. She is your ex. She radiates when she enters the room.

She is the bride. She is your ex. She is also tired, hangry and on the edge of overstimulation if pushed too far.

Possible moments of intimacy between Carlo + Eva.

VICTOR – the cater-waiter for the evening. He/him

Strong physical comedian/bit-lover. A liminal figure, a caterer with a shitty job, and a great boyfriend. A constant reminder of both life inside and outside of this moment.



NOTE ON CASTING

Audiences can always expect that Our Front will produce work that is by, for, and about queer stories and culture. Though we understand that there is no monolithic queer identity, we are committed to casting authentically and hope to empower all queer identifying performers, openly so or not, to submit themselves for consideration of roles that align with their lived experiences. We will never ask, nor presume or assume identities but hope to provide meaningful performance opportunities for those who seldom see themselves on stage. We will treat performers with respect and discretion in hopes of empowering all who honor us by sharing their talents.
